THE FACTS

President Bush Signed the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act into law on Oct. 13, 2007, effectively banning Internet gambling in the United States. Despite this development, questions remain as to whether certain types of gambling can be permitted at the state level, as do questions about specifically what types of businesses are at risk. Meanwhile, efforts are already underway to move legislation to regulate Internet gambling in the United States.
